Burleigh Headland National Park - Oceanview walk

Burleigh Headland features a variety of diverse terrains, rocky outcrops, eucalyptus forest, pandanus groves and beautiful Tallebudgera Creek. An upper and lower walking circuit that enters through rainforest and then breaks out to reveal spectacular views of the ocean.

What attracts visitors and locals to Burleigh Headland National Park?

- You can observe Australian wildlife in its natural habitat.
- Capture incredible photographs that you will want to frame!
- Catch a glimpse of a humpback whale during the winter and spring.
- Soak in the uninterrupted views of the Gold Coast from an elevated location.
- Watch local surfers, ride their boards on some of the best waves in the world.
- Keep fit and healthy in a fabulous environment.



Oceanview Walk - approximately 1.2km one way

There are unique rock formations to see and you will enter a dry forest. On a quiet day you may see bearded dragons perched on top of boulders and brush turkeys eagerly scratching the ground.
